



ZONES

Nature in the city: the triple zone approach

When developing new combinations and product concepts, Verver Export takes account of the 'triple zone approach' for nature in the city. Account is thereby taken of the distinctive characteristics of the urban environment when using bulbs, annuals and perennials for public planting. Let's list them for you again:





1. The core zone

In the core zone, the environment for plants and animals is almost entirely shaped by humans. It has its own (micro-)climate, the water system is usually artificial, and the original substrate has often disappeared. For Verver Export this is the space where concepts are used that involve display planting.



2. The marginal zone

In the marginal zone the natural environment for plants and animals is still largely intact (often with the exception of the soil structure). However, human activities mean that most of the original plants and animals have virtually disappeared. There is quite a lot of public green space, but this tends to be urban types adapted to the built environment. Verver Export develops concepts and applications for this zone that fit with a **functional planting** approach.



3. The transitional zone

In the transitional zone the environment for plants and animals is usually intact, including the original soil. There is only scattered development. The transitional zone can be very species-rich; it forms the boundary region and the contact zone between the city and the surrounding landscape. For this zone, Verver Export recommends more natural planting with bulbs for naturalising and perennial planting

planted mechanically in verges.

Taking account of the nature of a particular zone when designing and managing plantings results in variation in the planting and reinforces the identity of the various parts of the urban area. A useful assessment can be made by differentiating between three aspects: aesthetic quality, ecological quality and the usage value of the planting.

At Verver Export we are keen to help you think around this theme so that the right plant/concept ends up in the right place!

Our customers are highly creative in using the individual varieties and mixtures from the Verver Export catalogues. They find a way to use them everywhere, sometimes for one year, sometimes for several years, and of course also for naturalising. Triumph tulips The most important group for the flower bulb trade

This group of tulips was named in 1923 by N. Zandbergen from Rijnsburg in the Netherlands to identify a group of seedlings that he had bought a year or so earlier from the Haarlem company Zocher & Co. Triumph tulips originate from crosses of some early and Darwin hybrid tulips. They flower a little later than the single early tulips, and usually have larger flowers and larger leaves. They flower a little earlier on average and remain slightly shorter than the Darwin hybrids, with more matt colours. They are strong, sturdy tulips and are also widely used in forcing (floriculture). Many of the cultivars have a different coloured edge.

Impression series Important series of 'Pink Impression' mutants

The Impression series are mutations from the robust 'Pink Impression' cultivar (1979) from Jan van der Wereld from Breezand. Cultivation mainly takes place on plots around Breezand, an area with excellent soil quality. The tulip breeding is now handled by a number of other companies under the 'Vertuco' umbrella. The most recent Impression variant 'Blushing Impression' (2019) is the latest to be included in this catalogue. Older cultivars are 'Red Impression' (1994), 'Apricot Impression' (1996), 'Salmon Impression' (2000), 'Impression Design' (2000) and 'Sweet Impression' (2011).



Tulip growing area increasing 25 cultivars have a large share



The growing area of tulip bulbs has risen again this season by almost 350 hectares. The tulip bulb area is increasing year on year, by several hundred hectares per year. This growth goes hand in hand with years of scaling up in the sector. The sales market is also growing steadily, mainly due to good sales of cut flowers grown from bulbs. This also explains the dominance of approximately 25 cultivars that determine a large part of the acreage, with 'Strong Gold' as the absolute leader with more than 1,100 hectares!

Unfortunately, the 2020 Tulip Festival for professionals in Skövde (SE) was cancelled due to Covid-19. However, the results were so good that we would like to show you some highlights in this catalogue.

The coronavirus was not the first problem facing the city. In early February it was so hot that we had to try to slow down growth using snow from the ice rink and spruce twigs. Sadly, without much success. Nature fortunately came to the rescue and put the brakes on it itself.

Around 140,000 flower bulbs were planted in Garpaparken and central Skövde. Flower bulbs were planted in pots on the square and in the shopping streets, planting took place in the Kyrk parks (under renovation), a beautiful colour circle with many different tulip cultivars was planted in Garpaparken, there were machine-planted flower bulbs in verges around

the city centre and naturalising bulbs planted in bushes along footpaths.

With the help of the Streetmuseum app, everyone could take their own walk and enjoy the splendour of tulips along a marked footpath. The app provided information about the cultivars and mixtures that could be seen along the way. First class service from the city's gardening department!



Volatile compounds The individual flowers determine how strong they smell

Scent is caused by the detection of molecular compounds in the olfactory organ (the nose). The brain interprets the signals from the nose and then attaches a label to it that says "smells good", "smells bad", "beware of poison", "beware of danger"

Flowers produce volatile compounds which they release into the air and which stimulate the sense of smell. They produce different scents to attract specific insects or to repel enemies. In evolutionary terms, plants and insects are attuned to each other, so that specific insects are attracted to specific floral scents, creating the most advantageous situation for both. For the plants, this is all about reproduction and for the insects it is all about the food supply.

If a plant is being eaten by a caterpillar, it warns its environment by emitting volatile compounds. The plants nearby receive the signal and can prepare their defence strategies.





The 'trumpet' Difference between large-crowned and trumpet daffodils

In this catalogue, trumpet and large-crowned daffodils are listed as one group. This is partly because the effect generated by these daffodils is similar: they both have the recognisable flower shape that everyone imagines when they think of a daffodil.

The difference is in the size of the trumpet (cup/inner crown). The trumpet daffodil has one flower per stem, and the trumpet is longer than the petals. The large-crowned daffodil also has one flower per stem, and the trumpet is longer than a third of the petal length but not longer than the petals themselves.

Test location on Visingsö

In 2019, Verver Export entered a partnership with Janne Petersson (Visingsöäpplen) to set up a test location for concepts from Verver Export on the island of Visingsö (Sweden).

The site is used for both spring-flowering and summer-flowering bulb trials. Themes such as: perennials (under grass), winter hardiness and flowering period are studied in the plants.

Anemone coronaria will produce new flowers throughout the whole period. Only plant them in the spring in areas with (severe) frost in the winter. The Anemone coronaria tuber will not deteriorate if you plant them later. They will be completely dormant and can be kept for years, as long as they don't come become damp. The shelf life of the tubers is not unlimited of course, but it's not a problem to keep them for a year or so in a dry condition. 



Bee Wise Nectar 'tears'

The Imperial Crown was introduced in the Netherlands by Clusius in the 16th century. The Imperial Crown is found in the wild from southern Asia Minor, through northern Iran to Afghanistan and Pakistan. They can easily flower for several years. The flowers have a musky scent and produce large drops of nectar. Honeybees and bumblebees are regular visitors to the flowers.

There is a legend about why the flowers of the Fritillaria hang like they do. All the flowers bowed to Jesus on his way to Calvary in the garden of Gethsemane. They did this out of respect. But one flower remained arrogantly upright. An angel descended and scolded the flower. The flower blushed with shame and immediately bowed its head. And from then on it stayed in this position... crying. The tears continue to flow in the form of shiny drops of nectar.

Don't hesitate to plant the Dutch Iris in areas that you are naturalising. Eventually you will see the plants 'explode'. You will have lots of flowers.

Market expansion



In Puglia, Italy, the bulbs of the wild crested hyacinth (Muscari comosum) are eaten as a vegetable. It is called lampascioni, bulb of Venus, pampasciuni or pampasciuli. The lampascioni can be bought fresh at the markets in Puglia. Preparation takes a lot of time because lampascioni contains mucilage that can make them tricky to prepare. You can cook, fry, grill and pickle them.

The ancient Greeks considered the wild hyacinth to be a nutritious plant and the physician Claudius Galenus (131-201) reports that the Venus bulb is a highly effective aphrodisiac, stimulating the sex drive. The bulbs are harvested in early spring before flowering.
